

1 Privacy Notice

This notice relates to Inland Fisheries Ireland's ('IFI') privacy practices in connection with the public consultation process for the long term management plan for the Great Western Lakes. Inland Fisheries Ireland, 3044 Lake Drive, Citywest Business Campus, Dublin D24 CK66 acts as the 'Data Controller' with regard to your personal data.

1.1 General Statement

Any personal information which you provide to IFI will be treated with the highest standards of security and confidentiality, strictly in accordance with EU Regulation 2016/679 General Data Protection Regulation ("GDPR") and the Data Protection Acts 1988 to 2018.

1.2 Collection and use of Personal Information

When completing the public consultation questionnaire IFI will collect and process the following categories of personal data:

Identity Data – First name, surname.

Contact Data – Email address (where provided) for the purposes of stakeholder consultation and to receive notification once the plan is finalised.

Subjective data – questionnaire responses and feedback.

We process your personal information for the purposes of consultation on the development of a long term management plan for the Great Western Lakes.

The names of respondents and their submissions will be published on the IFI website at the end of the consultation process (i.e., at the time the document arising from the consultation is published). Any further information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person ("Personal data" as defined by Article 4 of the GDPR will be redacted prior to publication on the IFI website).

In accordance with data protection legislation, we must always have a legal basis for the processing of personal data. This may be because you have consented to our use of your personal data or processing is necessary for tasks carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of an authority vested in IFI.

1.3 Data Protection Principles

IFI shall perform its responsibilities under the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) in accordance with the following six data protection Principles:

- 1. Lawfulness, fairness and transparency
- 2. Purpose Limitation
- 3. Data Minimisation
- 4. Accuracy
- 5. Storage limitation
- 6. Integrity and Confidentiality

1.4 Your Rights as a Data Subject

As a data subject you have the following rights under the GDPR:

Right to Correction of personal data: You can request us to rectify any personal data that we are processing about you which is inaccurate.

Right to withdraw consent: Under the regulation consent should be freely given, specific, informed and provided via an unambiguous indication. Where we have relied upon your consent to process your personal data, you have the right to withdraw that consent at any time.

Right of erasure: You can request us to erase your personal data where there is no compelling reason to continue processing. This right only applies in certain circumstances; it is not a guaranteed or absolute right.

Right to data portability: You can request us to provide your personal data to you in a format which enables you to transfer that personal data to another organisation. You may have the right to have your personal data transferred by us directly to third party organisations if this is technically feasible.

Right to restrict processing of personal data: In certain circumstances you can request us to suspend our processing of your personal data. Where we suspend our processing of your personal data we will still be permitted to store your personal data, but any other processing of this information will require your consent, subject to certain exemptions.

Right to object to processing of personal data: You have the right to object to our use of your personal data which is processed on the basis of our legitimate interests. However, we may continue to process your personal data, despite your objection, where there are compelling legitimate business reasons to do so or we need to process your personal data in connection with any legal claims.

If you would like to make a complaint relating to the collection or processing of your personal data, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the Supervisory Authority which is the Data Protection
