"I have always been passionate about protecting our environment, even as a very young child. After studying Applied Biology in GMIT, I did a Degree in Environmental Science & Technology in IT Sligo. I have held environmental roles in various local authorities which provided me with brilliant, 'hands on' experience and paved the way for my job now with IFI."

Favourite part of the job

"What I love most is the variety. From investigating incidents of water pollution, monitoring water quality and the health of our fish stocks, to reviewing planning applications and running workshops in primary schools as part of our 'Something Fishy' programme – every day is different! It's also really great to be outdoors and know I am making a difference. The 'feel-good factor' from that is amazing."
